

Child custody arrangements after marriage breakdown without needing a judge

In the majority of cases it will be in the best interest of the children to have arrangements in place that allow each child to have a significant and meaningful relationship with both of their parents whilst growing up, even if they do not always live with them.

It is always best if parents can agree and work things out about their children between themselves. Just because your relationship has broken down doesn't mean that you stop being good parents.

At Matthews Folbigg we recommend to our clients that wherever possible they first try to talk to the other parent before making any big decisions about where the children will live or how much time the children can spend with their other parent.

We also recommend seeking child custody advice from a specialist family lawyer before you enter any binding agreements. Timely legal advice can help parents understand and have confidence about what options are available to them when making arrangements for their children after separation.

It can be very helpful for both parents to sit down with an experienced mediator or Family Dispute Resolution Practitioner (FDRP) to discuss any proposed parenting arrangements. The FDR practitioner can help advise you about what types of arrangements tend to work best for children of different ages or in particular family circumstances.

The FDR practitioner can assist parents to work together to draw up a parenting plan. However, you need to understand that even if a Parenting Plan is in writing and signed by both parties, it is not enforceable by a court.

Our specialist family law team can assist and advise about the best way to negotiate and reach an agreement about where your children are going to live and how much time the children will spend with the other parent which can be written up and made into an enforceable Court Order without needing a judge to decide.
